As we come to the end of the church year, our readings remind us of the end times, and today's gospel is no exception. We are reminded to be spiritually ready and prepared for what comes next, especially our own final end in death. These reminders are especially poignant as we are living with the results of the pandemic, remembering all the lives lost throughout the world in the past 8 months.

What does this story of 1st century Palestine Jewish wedding customs have to say to us today? Traditionally, the groom negotiated for the bride with her

father and family. The bartering could go on for days, a sign that the bride was indeed treasured. When both sides came to an agreement, the groom and his family attendants would arrive to take the bride to his home. Then the party would begin!

However, when the time came, half the women were locked out because they weren't ready after all their waiting; their lamps had gone out. Instead, they were at the store when it was time to enter the feast. How could this story have worked out differently? Could the women have been more prepared? Could they have changed and thought and planned ahead?

Looking to the first reading, I believe the emphasis is on being wise. Being wise in terms of Jesus means knowing that we are all waiting, and that this waiting is with the assurance that he will come; the waiting is not just a waste of time. And part of the waiting is having the oil to greet the bridegroom.

How do you wait? I'm usually impatient, trying to find the shortest line, the smallest crowd, the quickest way in and out. During these past 8 months, I have come to see the graces of waiting, of slowing down, of being attentive. I am more present to the One who will come, even though I don't know when.

We still have time to change. The door is not locked for us yet. God is available to us now with the gift of Wisdom, to show us what we must still do to keep a good supply of oil. We acknowledge our need and dependence upon God so that we may be able to shed the light of our faith on the world. May we be ready, living the life that Jesus recommended in last week's scriptures: being peaceful, and kind, and merciful... as we await our end time.

Catholic Education Sunday Nov. 8, 2020

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The theme for this year's Catholic Education Sunday is from the Book of Isaiah. In the context of our current pandemic, it offers us the prophet's words of solicitude, prophetic fulfillment, and hope in the face of challenge. Those who hope in the LORD shall renew their strength. (Isaiah 40:31, NRSV.) The pandemic continues to have a deep impact on every facet of our society, including the Catholic Education of our young people. During the shut-down of schools in the spring, Catholic Education faced this challenge by providing virtual classrooms, which continued to engage students in their academic learning and religious faith instruction. When the schools reopened in the fall, many new practices were put in place to adhere to the health precautions and to ensure student safety. In the midst of these challenges, Catholic Education has been embracing the call for renewal and inviting students and their families to look to the future with hope. On the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, the Alberta Bishops released the Pastoral Statement on the Impact of COVID-19 and the Call to Christian Renewal. The Pastoral Statement describes this as a "time for bold creativity and life-giving transformation for all." Some significant societal issues, which were hidden by the distractions of pre-pandemic life, are now very evident. This calls people of Faith, and especially our Catholic educators, to chart a prophetic path in addressing these issues now and in the future. "Specifically, we seek new ways to promote authentic human development and flourishing in the very way that we live, care for others, work, organize society and interact with one another. Moved by our faith in Christ and inspired by the principles of Catholic Social Teaching, we invite the Catholic community to join us in looking afresh at certain aspects of our life together in society, to discern and decide a course for true social, cultural and spiritual renewal." (Pastoral Statement on the Impact of COVID-19 and the Call to Christian Renewal) This call for renewal will be embraced by our young people through the role that Catholic education must play in strengthening authentic human development, which is essential for true social, cultural and spiritual renewal for the future of our society.

Catholic Education fosters high academic achievement and provides students with personal and communal spiritual formation. Catholic Education invites students to see each other and, indeed, the peoples of the world as their sisters and brothers. This fraternity calls the students to respond to those in need locally and globally. These good works help young people to seek the common good and to bring Christ's love and hope to others. May the efforts of everyone bring hope and renewed strength to all those committed to Catholic Education. In this time of pandemic, we extend to our Catholic school communities our prayers and blessing for the celebration of Catholic Education Sunday.
